



INTRODUCTION

The National Stoolball Associations (NSA) Club Charter Accreditation Scheme (Club Charter) is set out a number of separate documents, which are summarised below:

NSA Club Charter Accreditation Scheme – this is the primary document that sets out the principals of the scheme and the minimum standards that Clubs will have to attain to achieve Club Charter accreditation.

Rules of the scheme – this document sets out the rules that will govern the Club Charter scheme.

Application form – Clubs are required to complete this form to make application to the NSA for Club Charter accreditation.

Constitution – this is a template (marked with a red margin) that Clubs may use to prepare their own Club constitution.

Child protection policy – this is an NSA policy document (marked with a green margin) that Clubs should adopt.

Equity policy - this is an NSA policy document (marked with a green margin) that Clubs should adopt.

Players' code of conduct - this is an NSA policy document (marked with a green margin) that Clubs should adopt.

Spectators' code of conduct - this is an NSA policy document (marked with a green margin) that Clubs should adopt.

Officials' code of conduct - this is an NSA policy document (marked with a green margin) that Clubs should adopt.

Medical questionnaire – this is an NSA standard document that should be used by all Clubs.

Parental consent - this is an NSA standard document that should be used by all Clubs.

Risk assessment guidelines - this is an NSA standard document that should be used by all Clubs.

Risk assessment form - this is a template (marked with a red margin) that Clubs may use to prepare their own Club risk assessment.

Accident incident guidelines - this is an NSA standard document that should be used by all Clubs.

Accident record - this is an NSA standard document that should be used by all Clubs.

Development Plan - this is a template (marked with a red margin) that Clubs may use to prepare their own Club development plan.
